Mephibosheth = he who scatters or destroys <u>SHAME</u>


If our <u>PAST</u> is interfering with our <u>PRESENT</u>, more than likely someone dropped us along the way.

If our <u>PAST</u> is interfering with our <u>PRESENT</u>, more than likely someone dropped us along the way.

We cannot effectively deal with the <u>PRESENT</u> until we understand how we were dropped in the <u>PAST</u>.

We can identify our lameness when we begin to see our <u>REACTIVE-NESS</u>.






Lo Debar = pastureless








#### How can we overcome lameness in our lives?

- 4. RESOLVE to get up off the floor and sit at Jesus' table of grace (2 Samuel 9:11b-13).


